

Race Analysis: Have my reservations on Teylu despite a solid debut campaign. He surprised on debut on the Acton track here before backing up that effort and running a similar rating at this track and trip before a spell. He was meant to run here on Preview Day but was a late scratching after getting his leg up in the barriers. Teylu was right in the market there and his recent trial suggests he's tracking well. The one big knock is that there's only been 1 subsequent winner out of his latest outing which leaves a big question mark over the SP there. That could open the door for Written By Lucy who was given a quiet trial here a fortnight ago. She set up a good time in that trial and the winner of that hit out went on to score at Bathurst earlier in the week. Expect she'll have some fans late in betting and deservedly so. Let's Go Brandon trialed well in his own right and looks as though he won't be a maiden for too long. Happy to put a line through Noctua as she drops back to 1000m off a freshen. Best figures are 1400m or further and she looks like one the market may abandon in the opener.

Race Analysis: Not a race I'm looking to bet into. Gundy Guy is a good horse, I just wish this was 1200m for him. He peaked on the run fresh in the Federal/National Sprint Preview, I'm wary of the 1000m possibly being a touch sharp for him now. My leaning is that the old warrior Major Time may have some fans with the booking of Berry and the 9YO coming back from metropolitan company. He loves this track and trip, he looks the main pace influence in the race and he jumped \$5.50 in this same race last year with Berry on board. Fangela was a huge run in the National Sprint Preview a fortnight ago and some of his highest ratings are over 1000m. Stable seem to have him back close to his best and it wouldn't surprise to see him in the finish.

Race Analysis: Scratchings have changed this race with a number of key players coming out. Adolphus rates highest with Racing and Sports following a bold run in Highway company last start where he was beaten a half-length as favourite. Lost no admirers there and he'll put himself up on the speed from the outset. Berry is 1/1 on him, with that win coming in the Wagga carnival last year and he'll be tough to run down. Lord Finland has had the door open for him with a bit of speed out of the race. He should be able to kick up and possibly hold out Adolphus to set a tempo to Ash Morgan's liking. He did similar here a fortnight ago and he'll look the winner at some stage.

Race Analysis: Jacob's Ladder brings in a strong last start rating from Warwick Farm where he was beaten 2.6L. The form out of that has already worked out well and he looks primed for a big run with the Inglis Bonus attached. Ticks plenty of boxes and looks the one to beat, though there isn't a whole lot of edge in his price early. Karmardo looks set for this race, having finished 1.8L off the winner at Kembla Grange and he's been back to the trials since then. He sat on the speed at Kembla, so expect him to be right there again from the draw and he looks the pick of the next lot. Marais was solid on resumption at Rosehill when beaten 1.4L away and laid the foundations for a good campaign. He has had a few goes now though and the rating required to win this is likely to be closer than Metro quality than it is country. Happy to take a little set against him. Viktor went around at Newcastle on Friday and is expected to come out.

Race Analysis: Snow In May was well backed first-up at Randwick in the Eskimo Prince but was a touch disappointing there. The form out of that race has been fair, with horses running to the figures they produced there rather than improving on them which is a slight query. This is a much easier race today and her trial between runs was good at Randwick. Hard to forecast her being close to her best off that fresh effort, and that may open the door for her rivals. French Ruler was a very strong run first-up at Rosehill when clocking some good splits late in the race. He's a lightly raced gelding who now gets Rawiller on board and he may sit a touch closer from the barrier today. He looks to have plenty of upside and if he can improve as anticipated, the gap between he and Snow In May in the market should be much tighter. Shangri La Spring is a colt by Castelvechio and has trialled well for the Waterhouse and Bott yard. There doesn't look to be too much speed inside him so he should be able to cross and lead or sit outside leader. He's another one with good upside and the stable would no doubt have better races in store for him. Atelier looks a nice filly on the way up and she's no hopeless after putting up a strong rating at Rosehill last start.

Race Analysis: Thinking King Of Pop should be outright favourite in the Black Opal. He was very impressive winning at the midweeks on debut, running a better rating and a good time at Warwick Farm. He rates similarly to the stable's Opal winner Trapeze Artist at the same time and the late splits hinted there was a little more to come. Looks to set up perfectly for him from the draw and he can remain unbeaten. Nashville Jack comes through one of the strongest pieces of 2YO form we've seen thus far in the Silver Slipper. He bypassed the Black Opal Preview a fortnight ago to run in the Silver Slipper, going around a 40-1 chance and not being disgraced by any means. He should be in a good spot on settling down and if he can finish off in similar fashion, he'll be hard to hold out. Farcited was a strong winner of the preview and while he did nothing wrong there, it would've been good to see Perle De Chocolat do something yesterday. Steel Knight shouldn't be as far behind Farcited as he was last start as he almost ran him down. Wouldn't surprise to see the Neasham/Archibald charge be closer to the speed and he finished off in eye-catching fashion last time out.

Race Analysis: Seems a race in two at the top now that Our Anchorage has been scratched. That form looks the way to go through Palmetto who should be favourite if he crosses and sits up front for Tim Clark. That is the question though from an outside barrier, though there doesn't seem to be too much pace inside him aside from Redstone Well. He only meets Redstone Well a 1/2kg worse at the weights now for beating him 1.7L last time they met. The first furlong of the race will tell the tale, but if Palmetto crosses from out wide then he should be favourite. Should Palmetto not cross, Redstone Well looks to get complete control up front second-up. He wasn't far away fresh and with the added fitness on his side now, he'll be tough to run down. Aside from them it seems a raffle. Not sure how well Touristic is going at the minute, but he'd be a single figure chance if you expected him to run his best. It's hard to see that coming to fruition from barrier 11 and after a couple of plain runs in Melbourne. There are some positives as he gets back to a bigger track and in a clockwise direction, though he would need to get back to his best. Strathtay was a second-up winner last campaign when up to 2000m and he's in similar form this campaign. Drawn to get every possible and can be in the finish with improvement likely.

Race Analysis: Coastwatch is running on Friday at Newcastle and is expected to come out. That leaves Bjorn's two at the top of betting with Wategos and Highlights. Highlights is an interesting one here, working his way back from 2000m two starts ago to now be in the National Sprint. He put up a strong rating for this race last start over the mile and the time figure there was very strong. He should push forward for King and while he's only placed 3/10 at the trip, he has run competitive figures for this race in those outings. Last start rating has him on top over the stablemate. Wategos has resumed with two 7th place finishes, but the figures behind those outings hold up well in this field, particularly now that he drops to 54kg. He's won 3/4 third-up and a wet track by this point won't hurt him. He's turned in some big figures last campaign which are good enough to win this, and he's trending back toward that level of form now. Berkshire Shadow gets the blinkers off today and has gone around in some strong races. Trial was sound without setting the world alight and his previous first-up efforts are right in line with where he needs to be. Magnatear is racing well and has claims while Cliff House looks the best 'local' hope in the race.

Race Analysis: It's hard not to like what Deal N' Dash did on debut at Rosehill, storming over the top to score impressively and clock some slick splits late in the process. He lobs here an odds-on chance and rightfully so, bringing a high rating last start and a good time alongside it. He's right in the market for the Sydney Derby and this looks like a good stepping stone for him to get there. Rumbling Night disappointed first-up at Kembla but bolted in at Newcastle second-up last campaign. Can run a better race here.

Race Analysis: Rockola was off a 444 day spell when running in town first-up and posting a strong figure there. He has to carry the big weight, but if he can reproduce the number he ran fresh then he'll be far too good for these. Should get a nice run in behind and be launching late. Yabby Pump looks suited to this trip first-up on the back of a nice trial recently. Maiden win rates nicely and he looks ready to go to another level now. Brazen Crime was well backed on debut and depending on what lens you look through, it was a nice prep run for something else. 1300m suits a touch better, but suspect further than this will be hit pet trip. He should get plenty of favours though and it wouldn't surprise to see him bounce back to winning ways. Dupli Kate was a solid run in the Guineas Prelude here a fortnight ago and is not to be discounted. Canadian Ruler is a newcomer to the Matthew Dale barn and has some solid figures behind him in metropolitan grade. Still a Class 1 galloper and should appreciate dropping back to this level.
