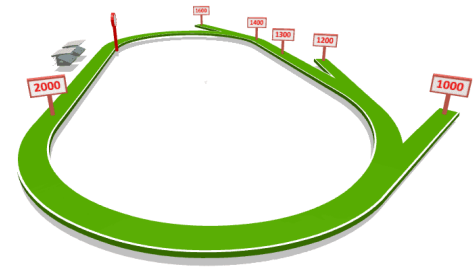

Race Analysis: Noctua was well backed here last start and shed the maiden tag in good style. She jumped the \$1.45 favourite there following a good run on Black Opal Day, and both those ratings stand out in this field. She'll be on the speed from barrier one and the apprentice claim will help her chances. She'll be hard to run down. Kenyan Charm has recently joined the John Nisbet stable and looks nicely placed back in grade and with the in-form Brodie Loy in the saddle. This is much easier than the recent events she's been in and the blinkers go on first time today. He best ratings are good enough and she's open to improvement being so lightly raced. Can put herself in the finish. Love Of Air is on the quick turnaround but ran a good race here in stronger company first-up. Not the worst.

Race Analysis: La Signora Dane was very impressive first-up in a BM55, picking up his rivals and running away to win impressively. This shapes similarly, albeit in tougher company, but she should be better for the fresh run and she can go on with the job. Rates highly with the scope for further improvement. Asuriito creates interest. He was a 3YO on the rise last campaign before failing here at the end of last campaign in a BM65 but he lost no admirers. His fresh run was very average despite the market expectation there and he reunites with Jimmy Innes Jnr. this time. He looks a key speed influence and while he's drawn wide, I'm happy to forgive last start and expect him to bounce back. Miss Scoop stuck on well on the Heavy track at the Sapphire Coast and wasn't beaten far two back at Moruya. Best ratings stack up, but she'd need to return to that level to catch what Siovy Dane did last time out.

Race Analysis: It's easy to spot where the race should be assessed with the form, but just how to assess it is the question coming in. We don't often see horses first-up over 2000m, but we have two in this event and they look the ones to hold the market around. Aethelflaed was last seen in the Victorian Oaks 526 days ago and will be fitter for three trials coming in. She was back at the trials shortly after the Oaks, but then spent a year on the sidelines until now. She has the runs on the board with her form and with only five starts under her belt, there's still the feeling she can get back to that level despite - what is suspected to be - an injury layoff. She's trialled well coming in and she's expected to hold plenty of market percentage. The other is Turntyne for Brodie Loy and the Neasham & Archibald barn who was a narrow winner at Bathurst before a spell. He found them too quick over the mile on debut at Wyong and judging by his trials coming in, he looks an out-and-out stayer. Trust Loy to sum up the situation well though and it wouldn't surprise if the stable have bigger races in store for their 3YO. La Gracia is racing well without a win and is worth including, while Ana Carolina can put herself close to the speed and give a sight.

Race Analysis: 2YO's are usually poorly weighted in these events and it takes a good one to beat the older horses, and that may be what Wonderful Mistake is. She flew late on debut and arguably threw the race away with her inexperience, so she'll be better for the debut performance. While she is likely to get back, she may be a level above her rivals here and she deserves to be at the top of the market on ratings. Noctua is the guide in the opening event of the day. Der Blaue Reiter was taken to Kembla for his trial coming into this and he was very impressive there and the time stacked up against other trials on the day. The horse that finished second to him was solid in a Provincial Maiden earlier this week and that looks a good line to take. Expect him to sit up on the speed and give a big sight. Bardette was a very sneaky trial here a fortnight ago and looks to have some ability. She wasn't allowed to let rip in that outing and now we can see what's under the bonnet. Collett rides and she can be trendy in betting.

Race Analysis: Keen to bet up on Demanding Mo in this. He's never really been one of mine, but what he's done since returning to the Dryden & Snowden barn has been fantastic and he's racing in career-best form. Not disgraced in the National Sprint again and only knocked off by a smart one last time out. This shapes nicely from a good barrier and if he can run up to his last start rating, he'll be very hard to beat. Craving Magic ties in through the form that beat Demanding Mo last start and that is a great starting point. However, at level weights today, he just hasn't run up to the ratings of Demanding Mo on Racing and Sports' scale. Deserves to be second pick on what we've seen lately, though he'll have to go to another level now to catch Mo, and while not impossible, it does seem tough in this scenario. Body Bob has to lug the big weight, but this is the first time we've seen him first-up over 1200m. His trial coming in was solid and while they've try to get him to settle in behind horses in recent campaigns, with a lack of speed evident he can go to the front as he did when performing at his best figures. He's got the class to handle the weight and can give a big sight first-up. My Last Hooray has always hinted he wants this trip or further and should be fitter for the last-start effort behind Demanding Mo. No beaten far there, though the niggles he meets Demanding Mo worse at the weights.

Race Analysis: Siding with Il Passero in the first leg of the Quaddie following an impressive victory at this track 3 weeks ago. The slight rise to 1400m should do him the world of good and he showed last start he can sit on the speed and kick away from his rivals. He's on an upward trajectory faster than his rivals and if he can improve as anticipated, he can bring up back-to-back wins. Had to think Snowy didn't handle the heavy going at the Sapphire Coast on resumption and she still ran reasonably well there when \$1.60. Back on top of the ground now is a big tick, though she runs head first into one breathing fire. While there's little doubt she's expected to be better now, she'll have to not only improve, but run a new peak rating to match what Il Passero did last start, and that's a tough ask for any horse. Second pick in the market seems correct. Canadian Ruler and Xceptional Fella did battle last start over the 1300m journey a fortnight ago with Xceptional Fella getting the job done there. Xceptional Fella is closer in the market to Canadian Ruler this time, though more seems to be in the favour of Matthew Dale's charge. He'll be fitter now, he meets Xceptional Fella better at the weights and he'll be right up on the speed. Media Frenzy will find this easier and has claims.

Race Analysis: Not a race I'm looking to dive into early. Looks to be a number of these around a similar mark on Racing and Sports ratings, though Rose Diamond a looks a likeable character in this event on the back of her Victorian form. Back to 1400m with a month between runs as she joins the new barn, though she should get every chance under Penza and from a good gate. Wild Sensation turned in a better run last start at the Provincials but was 60-1 there on a wet track. He was beaten at both Port Macquarie and Scone when in the market and while up to 1400m now, that's enough to be against him slightly. Rufus Atticus was good late last start, but needs some luck again from the wide draw. As does Hell Of A Fox who always seems to find trouble. Now with the Pepper stable though with the strike jockey on board and it wouldn't surprise me to see her have some fans late in betting.

Race Analysis: Good Prize relished the rise to the mile last start, clocking some fast splits late when picking up and spitting out his rivals at this track and trip. He drops right in weight off that effort and while the draw may be a little sticky, he has shown some tactical speed in the early stages. Looks an improving type now and it's easy to forecast him going to another level again now. The Right Rein was behind him two back before running in the Murrumbidgee Cup on Sunday in an attempt to gain entry into the Wagga Gold Cup. While he does meet Good Prize better at the weights, the market had them pegged about the same last time they met and it's hard to think he's any better than what we've seen. That has me leaning the way of Good Prize over The Right Rein. Pioneer Lass brings down some good form from Brisbane and looks well placed in this event from a good barrier. Up to the mile is a big tick and she seems a big threat. Silent Impact was good here fresh and isn't without a hope.

Race Analysis: Hoping Richard Litt can have a big day as Hazel Jean is another one of his who looks to have some value in early markets. While only getting the job done narrowly last start, the form has been franked with the second horse coming out and winning since. The inside barrier may be a slight concern, but she looks to have plenty of class and it wouldn't surprise to see the market swing in her favour. Teylu has done nothing wrong however, bumping into a smart one who scored at short odds at Albury on Thursday and Teylu held his own there. Up to 1200m now should suit this son of D'argento and while he would have to improve to match what Hazel Jean has done, it wouldn't surprise to see him do it. Those two look the race, though She'sadare was very good late in the piece over this trip when breaking her maiden last start. She's not out of this. Boom In The Dark was disappointing last time out over 1300m but he's worth forgiving for one bad run. Heywood replaces the apprentice hoop in a big push for his chances and he can return to form.
