

**Race Analysis:** We're back onto the Acton for the winter months, but the synthetic surface does tend to play very fair, particularly early in the season. We haven't had a wet day since the new surface has been laid, though using data from Synthetic tracks in Victoria, Racing and Sports data suggests that the track in fact plays faster in wet conditions than it does when a clear and warm day. As for the first race on the program, it's not one I'm looking to dive into early in betting. Seeking To Win brings in a good figure from a CL1 at Moruya last time out when narrowly beaten after leading the field. That is a big key as she may be able to burn across from the wide gate and put herself on the speed under Blaike McDougall. She appears one of the main pace influences in the event and she's deserving to be at the top of the market based on recent figures. There's not a whole lot between She'sadare and Prince Papa, both dropping back in distance after disappointing runs in their respective races and drawn next to each other. One of those 'if you like one, you have to like both' scenarios there. Wegotabetterhoffa is another speedy customer and comes right back from a Federal last start. She does have early speed and suspect it'll be handlebars down from the gate. She'll give them something to chase.

**Race Analysis:** It's not often you see a horse that was 50-1 at their last start jump close to odds-on at their next outing, but we could see that the with Joe Pride-trained Contaldo. He was one for the 'eyes guys' at Warwick Farm, running into dead ends and showing his best over the concluding stages. His best form in Europe was at a mile or further which he gets out to today and his runs this time in have hinted his European ratings aren't far away. Strikes a very suitable race and can pick up his first Australian win. Koning ticks plenty of boxes coming back to this grade. He may not have run out the 2100m at Wyong last start, with his runs prior rating highly among this field in stronger company. He has early speed, and the booking of McDougall is a big key to his chances. Black Bugatti comes off a strong effort in heavy going at Newcastle most recently. Keatings is in good form of late and if he runs up to the figures he's been producing in wet going, he'll be right in the finish. Happy to be against Ana Carolina back in distance.

**Race Analysis:** Looks a two-horse race and the market has it about right. Indefensible may not have handled the wet track first-up at Wyong over 1100m when tiring late and ending up well beaten. She still managed to finish fourth there and the best run of her career has come on a firm deck at Canterbury. She'd trialed impressively heading into her fresh run and this looks a great opportunity to show what she's capable of. Wouldn't surprise to see her be a fan favourite back on top of the ground and with her early speed. Souk resumes for the new stable today and brings solid Victorian form up after being trained by Anthony & Sam Freedman. He jumped a \$3.25 chance first-up at Seymour last campaign and the ratings he's produced stack right up. Those two have a class edge on the raced brigade with Deeply for the in-form Gratz Vella stable looking the best of the unraced brigade.

**Race Analysis:** Bit of a raffle to begin the Quaddie. Rotho Bro was a good winner first-up at Mudgee over 1100m before a plain run last start at Goulburn on a Soft track. Back to this trip may help his chances and the booking of McDougall is a big tick. Christmas Star looks one on the RAS ratings that could present some value. She was out to 1400m last start at the Sapphire Coast and disappointed, but her two efforts prior have her right at the pointy end of a race like this. Happy to think she didn't run out the extra journey there and the Gundagai run is the formline to assess her on. Thinking she's the one worth backing early doors. The rest of them seem a bit similar. Isagura will need a touch of luck from out wide, though her best form would see her right in the mix, but that seems a little hard to forecast with the setup she has today and the apprentice hoop on board. Giza resumed on a good note at the Sapphire Coast as the \$1.90 favourite, though there's been just 1 placegetter from 8 starters since which doesn't give me much confidence. Dollythediva ran a similar rating to win at Queanbeyan fresh, but much like Isagura, luck well need to be her friend.

**Race Analysis:** Think there's a chance to play in race five with Exotic Dancer bringing in strong form lines that shape well. She went under narrowly as a \$3.40 chance fresh at Orange before going to Wyong last start and failing in heavy going when also back to 1100m. She was on an upward trajectory prior to that and getting back out in distance is a positive for her. She looks to get her chance on the map and with some niggles around her rivals, there seems to be some value in her price. Zielle was a sectional star two runs back and ran up to those figures when winning at Goulburn most recently. She was strong from the back of the pack there, putting up a strong rating and one that matches what Exotic Dancer has done thus far. Slight rise in trip shouldn't be an issue, and she makes plenty of appeal. Both Zielle and Exotic Dancer have ratings above the peak of Xceptional Fella which makes him the odd one out at the top of the market. While a consistent horse, his consistency is at a rung below what we've seen from Zielle and Exotic Dancer. He'll give himself every chance close to the speed, but the filly's may have the class edge on him.

**Race Analysis:** Thinking this is more of a two-horse race than the market is telling us. Rumours Abound went to Saturday grade at Caulfield following a narrow defeat as an odds-on favourite in the Flat Knacker at Albury and was just outclassed there. This looks to shape better for her this time, and she'll be right up on the speed from a favourable gate and Lyon strikes at 19% when riding for the Stubbs barn. She looks a deserved favourite. King Gutho appears the main danger after running on well fresh in a similar event on the course proper here. He tends to improve second-up into the campaign and it's always worth noting when Cleary puts Jess Taylor on his runners. His best figures are right up to the ratings Rumours Abound has run up to recently and he'll be strong to the line. Miss Emma looks next best off a strong figure in a CL1 at Wagga and appears to have turned a corner in recent efforts, but this is harder again.

**Race Analysis:** Joe Pride brings a strong hand to the National Capital and Our Jewel looks to round out the day on a winning note. She never really got into the race in trying conditions at Wyong last start but jumped a \$3.70 chance fresh at Gosford over 1200m. Her trials leading into her fresh run were solid and while she has drawn wide, she looks to have plenty of class. McDougall's booking is a big tick, and she looks the one to beat in the finale. The stablemate Cloud Of Dust comes through the same race as Indefensible earlier in the card, so that will give us a good line on the race. She maps for a lovely run under Penza, and she probably hasn't been given an opportunity to show her best in her career thus far. This looks a very suitable race however and today may be her day. The preparation and barrier of Irish Jig is enough for me to be soft on him. He had two trials off an 88-day break and has had both runs over the mile this time in. Now drops back to 1280m off 20 days when his best figures have been over further. There seems to be more against him than for him. Bardette is itching to win a race. She hasn't been given much chance in both her runs this time in, but the rise in trip is a big tick and she'll be closing off nicely.
