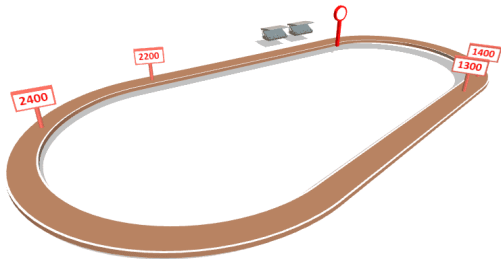

Race Analysis: Happy to let the opening race through to the keeper with the majority of the form tying together after this race was split into two divisions at our last meeting. The race Jazz All Knight won a fortnight ago was faster overall and faster home than the race Tantalum won, but they were set up differently, which has me leaning the way of She'sadare and Jazz All Knight in this one. Tantalum's race was set up by a slick tempo up front with others stopping in front of her. While she was first-up, it's hard to see that race shape repeating in this event which would favour the evenly paced She'sadare and Jazz All Knight. They'll put themselves close to the speed from favourable barriers and give themselves every chance.

Race Analysis: This might end up being a solid maiden in the weeks to come, particularly at the top end. Azzucca dipped at the end of last campaign in a strong maiden but had shown ability prior to that on the Turf course here. Comes in without a trial, but the Vella stable is striking at 26% from his past 50 runners and he looks to get plenty of favours off the inside barrier. While it's easy to see why he's favourite, I think there's some value in the early price of the Vigouroux-trained Unreal Expectation on debut. His latest trial at Hawkesbury was great from the front when winning and turning in a solid time against the Open trial on the day. Lever makes the trip to stick with him, and his racing pattern is very attractive. Happy to mark him close to Lightly Sparkled who never really got into it fresh at Goulburn on a wet track. His maiden form last campaign makes for good reading, and she'll be right in the finish if she can return to her best. Had my queries on Mctominay prior to his debut and while he was good at the Sapphire Coast and improvement is expected, I'm willing to put my neck on the line and think he's the least likely of those in the market.

Race Analysis: Baggage Handler ticks plenty of boxes coming to the Acton track and looks loaded with upside. He jumped an odds-on chance when fresh last campaign over 1000m at Albury, leading and winning impressively and posting a very strong rating for a BM58. He went to Moonee Valley after that where he disappointed, but he has trialled well coming in and he brings in the highest peak rating of the field. He'll carry the top weight, but if he can run up to the same fresh rating from last season - which his trial suggests he can - the weight won't be an issue. Xspiritous will be there to challenge in the run and does have race fitness on her side. If there's a hint of weakness in Baggage Handler, she'll be the first to strike.

Race Analysis: Waiting to see how this market unfolds early doors with the two leading contenders on ratings drawn out wide. Both London Boy and Cold Mist possess early speed however which is a key to their chances. London Boy went under as the \$1.40 favourite at Goulburn last start when having his chance. He's turned on some strong figures despite going under and the 4kg claim of Cole can come in handy, especially with his early speed. If he jumps well, he'll roll across and take catching, particularly if he can run up to his ratings. What Quayde Krogh does aboard Cold Mist will be interesting, whether he lets the speed go or holds the lead from barrier eight. He surprised two back and ran up to that effort last start when gunned down by what looks a smart one. He seems to have taken a liking to the Acton surface and he's the main danger on his last two ratings.

Race Analysis: Think the market has it about right early doors, though I do expect Limburg and Remadosi to be a little bit tighter come start time. Limburg was a short-priced favourite at Goulburn last start but remained to the inferior going along the inside and was gunned down by an impressive winner on debut. He was best of the rest there and put up a strong rating in defeat, higher than what it takes to win a standard/average CL1/MDN. He'll give himself every chance to be at that level, with Remadosi rated alongside the gelding off her narrow defeat at the Sapphire Coast. The softer gate could see her much closer to the speed which will be imperative to her chances, as she's just been left with plenty to do her past couple. She's the danger on ratings and she looks the danger with the expected race shape as well.

Race Analysis: Great Federal once again after the three-way photo finish a fortnight ago! Those three that hit the line in unison lob again, and while Chop The Ice held on to score, I'm happy to let him through to the keeper at his early price. Mogo Magic was almost a month between runs there but didn't give in and he looks the main pace influence in the race this time around, a key to his chances. Craving Magic was well backed last start off a short break and just didn't get his nose down on the line. He was strong late in the piece there and the slight rise to 1280m is a big tick and probably more favourable to him than Mogo. Thinking there's still a couple of ratings points in there to squeeze out of him, and that could see him in front at the post this time. Love Shuck brings different form into the race off a last-start Warwick Farm disappointment. His past couple have been plain, but his form prior rates highly among the rest of the field. Back to this level looks a big tick and if he's worth keeping on side at the early quote.

Race Analysis: I'm Still recovering from Irish Jig getting run down last start after bolting in here two back - but the only niggle to find out of that race - if any - was that Guymer may have gone too slow through the middle stages. The time produced last start was much slower than what he showed here two back and with Guymer remaining in the saddle, he may have learned from his last start. While he did dip in his rating, the win here two back stacks right up to what Cifonelli did last start, though when comparing the times between the two, Cifonelli came through a much slower race. I'd argue that makes the win more impressive though, with her settling position and the way she put them away late in the race. His form may have been franked earlier in the card (Cold Mist R4) and it wouldn't surprise to see him sit closer from a softer barrier. Those two stand out on ratings and look the most likely to run up to their best. Angel In The Wind has moved to the Nick Olive stable since her last start at Wyong. She's been competitive and in the market at Provincial level - usually a strong guide to races like this. I was neither here nor there on her recent trial, but if the Olive stable can let her rip where she left off last campaign, she'll be challenging. While Noctua comes through the Irish Jig race last start, I'm thinking she'd have to improve sharply to turn the tables and that's hard to forecast on what she's produced recently.
