Race Analysis: Looking to be into the opener with some value around those behind him. Thinking Brutal Belle can be ahead of Souk when the gates open with the profile she brings into the race. Pepper has had good success recently with similar types (Hell Of A Fox and Helluva Soiree - for the same connections funnily enough) and she jumped a \$3.75 chance first-up over 1000m at Coffs. Winkers go on which may see her a touch sharper over the shorter trip. Plenty to like and it wouldn't surprise to see her the trendy tip late. Similar could be said for Your Magic who trialled well leading into his debut performance but may have just come to the end of it at the Sapphire Coast. That Maiden turned out alright however and Loy riding is a big push for his chances. With some niggles around Souk, I can see Your Magic shortening up based on the upside he possesses. Souk hasn't done a whole lot wrong, turning in solid figures here two back as a \$1.65 chance and again as a \$2.25 elect at the Sapphire Coast most recently when on the very quick turnaround. They led with him on that occasion, and he was only gunned down late - and those tactics seem likely, but if punters can stump up again is the question.

Race Analysis: Not looking to bet into this race with mixed formlines and what appears to be little edge in the early market. Guerrera comes to the Pepper barn from Queensland where she had performed well on the Poly Track at the Gold Coast prior to a spell. Claim comes in handy from Baker, as does the inside draw, though she seems short enough on the Racing and Sports ratings. Zambezi River took up a prominent role last start at this track and trip in a stronger race. Blinkers go on again signalling their intent, with the weight coming down after the claim. His recent numbers are solid, but he's not won for a long time and it's hard to have him much shorter than he already is. Champagne In Lace is one that I can see having some support. She was favourite in similar events prior to the break and boasts a strong record at this track and trip. Looks to get a kind run and her recent trial was solid enough, but with some unknowns about the others it makes me hesitant of marking her much shorter.

Race Analysis: Due Calzini may have bumped into a smart one last start, but he beat the rest of the field comfortably at Wagga over 2000m. While he's always shown signs that he's a good horse, he hasn't done a whole lot of winning, albeit he's been pitched into some strong races. To mark him much shorter means you have to push a couple who are right there with him on R&S Ratings. Remadosi is one of those. She just got into a horrible spot early in the race and left herself with too much to do. Up to 1900m looks a good play, though she can't be giving her rivals as big a head start as she did last time. Doc March jumped out of the ground late to just miss at Wagga over the mile last start, clocking some fast splits in the process. Steps up to 1900m today with the tongue tie going on and McDougall sticks with him. Can't leave him out of calculations.

Race Analysis: Plenty are rated around the same level in this event and have met in recent times, making it hard to nail down one early in betting. Straight Fire and Avonview met at this track and trip on the 6th of June, with the former defeating Avonview by 0.8 lengths. Avonview was rather plain last start at Wagga, but happy to overlook that effort and assess him on his form here prior. He gets a weight swing in his favour over Straight Fire. Hard to knock Straight Fire however based on the last run at Bathurst and those two should be heading the market. Happy to leave Taumata out of calculations early doors. They tend to run at a more even tempo on the Acton surface which should help his chances, and while he hit the line alongside Avonview two starts ago, he was fresh on that occasion. I think he wants further than this now and they may be a little sharp for him. Ferrari Man makes some appeal and there could be a touch of value in his price. Found one better in this grade two back before a strong effort in a BM82 at Dubbo most recently. Can sit on the speed and give a bold sight.

Race Analysis: Going against the market in the Federal, with Fine Vintage shaping as a big improver second-up into the campaign. He struck a deteriorating surface first-up over 1000m at Wagga and only faded inside the final furlong, but that should bring him on second-up where he's a winner previously. A firmer deck looks a big tick for him as well, with Brodie Loy hopping back in the saddle. Maybe most importantly, he's a key player when it comes to the speed of the race and with the aid of an inside barrier, that makes him an attractive commodity. No big issues for Craving Magic however who has built a handy record for the Potter stable, though coming back to 1000m seems the niggles. He's shown good strength late in his recent races, but it's his early speed which may leave him with too much to do late in the piece. Chop The Ice met his rivals worse at the weights last start for a narrow win two back but lost no admirers. Now with Peebles claim, he gets in light and should lob just off the speed. Ferrari was too good here when close to the speed last start and is likely to be prominent again with no weight on her back.

Race Analysis: Cold Mist has had his chance his past couple and while he hasn't been beaten all that far, he meets one off a similar profile to what beat him last time out. He continues to improve, albeit by not much, though he'll make his own luck on the speed and if he can continue his current trajectory, he'll be in front for a long way, though I think he'll drift however with how Unreal Expectation ran on debut. That was 1080m, but he looked gone on straightening and his work through the line was very solid. That rating was better than what Cold Mist ran on the same card, and he looks open to further improvement. Looks to map nicely from the barrier, Lever sticks and he can go one better this time. Mackinaw Peach got too far back last start at Kembla when flying home in good splits to be beaten 2.5L. Ticks a few boxes, particularly with McDougall on board and can put his best foot forward. Mctominay was better last start at Moruya on the 7-day back up and out to 1200m. He's on the quick turnaround again, though he was no match for Unreal Expectation here two back and it's hard to see him turning the tables.

Race Analysis: Keen to see Rippana back in action in the final event of the day. She was improving through the grades nicely before hitting a Heavy deck at the Sapphire Coast and never looking comfortable. Now back onto a firm deck on her home surface, she looks to get all the favours close to the speed. Up to 1280m now off a freshen which is interesting, but she looked a very progressive type before she failed last start. She can continue to work through the grades. Happy to mark Burrowa and Angel In The Wind the same price early doors. Burrowa was set up to win here last start, dropping right back in grade and running them all off their feet to win impressively. It's hard to see that effort being repeated however in this tough event and with a few pacey rivals engaged. He'll be hard to run down, but there looks to be a couple with more class now. Angel In The Wind was very strong first-up for the new stable but did have a gun run in transit. He'll need some luck from the barrier, though he looks open to plenty of improvement and the slight rise in trip is a big tick. London Boy is another who will need some luck out wide, but he showed plenty of grit last start to get the job done despite the wide run.
