**Race Analysis:** Not a whole lot between those at the top of the market and that's reflected in early betting, though a case could be made for Take The Chance to be on top. The map looks to play a big role in this event with just seven horses engaged, with Take The Chance a key pace influence. Adding to that, he beat home early pick Tjaka at Warren last start, albeit this race being very different. Tjaka has been costing herself chances at victory at the start of her races, being way too far back - though that doesn't look to change. She's been a Sectional Star in races earlier this campaign and looks primed to be adding to the winning column soon, but her racing pattern makes it hard to pin her down on top, particularly with the Racing and Sports ratings saying there's not much between them. Bardette is another who looked poised to strike at her past couple but falls into a similar category to Tjaka with her racing style. This may be an opportunity for Bronnet-Prag to take the bull by the horns and show what the filly can do when ridden efficiently, as the sectionals early in her career suggested there was something under the hood. She was well supported last start due to those splits though she looked comfortably and threw the towel in pretty quickly. The rise in trip suits, but I'm hesitant to mark her much shorter.

**Race Analysis:** Brutal Eyes comes through a good maiden where she set up a solid time figure from the front. While the winner of that race has since disappointed, the horse who finished behind Brutal Eyes won at Moruya last week. While new to the Kelley stable, she resumed with similar ratings to her Victorian efforts and looks to have scope for improvement after blowing the cobwebs out 14 days ago. Colorado Sun lands as the second pick in early betting after a quiet trial leading in. Dryden trained the dam who got over some ground, so the 1280m first-up should be right up his alley. He was bolting in his only trial but was all dressed up with nowhere to go and that creates excitement as he faces the starter for the first time. Wouldn't surprise to see the money come for him late and it'll be key if it does come. C'mon Wicksy comes through the same trial where Billy Owen didn't ask a whole lot of him after sitting up on the speed. It was a solid trial however and there looks to be a long tail to this maiden.

**Race Analysis:** Good race with Fine Vintage stepping out in distance third-up after a strong win from the front here 21 days ago. He was just too good from the front that day and with the scratching Cyclone Rupert this morning, it leaves the door open for back-to-back wins despite the rise in weight. He maps to find the front again and will prove hard to gun down. Missile Leader is the fresh blood, coming off a solid first-up performance at Kembla Grange. He was coming off a year-long break there and did loom as a winning chance as they turned for home. He felt the pinch late on the heavy going and has been given plenty of time to recover from that effort, He showed plenty of ability early in his career and the first-up run shows he's not far off recapturing that form already.

**Race Analysis:** Thinking there's some value about the debutant Prophet's Promise. He trialed on the Acton back in May before going for a short break. The 3YO hails from a successful family all trained by the Dryden & Snowden barn and he looks to have his share of ability. The first and third horses in his trial were good when they went to the races and Guymer sticks from the trial. Looks to have found a suitable race on debut and can make a winning start to his career. Soo Crazy bumped into a sharp one first-up from a break when sitting up on the speed. He felt the pinch late and is expected to be better for that performance. Can roll forward from out wide and give a bold sight. Zoodoo was a 50-1 chance at Newcastle last start but turned in a strong performance in defeat. He'll appreciate coming back to Country level and it wouldn't surprise to see him turn his form right around.

**Race Analysis:** Guerrera bolted in over this track and trip at his stable debut 21 days ago when leading the field. This is a tougher race, but he turned in figure that has enough substance to suggest he's capable of better. His old form from Victoria is now within his grasp and this sets up nicely for him up front once again. Perigean gets the visors on for the first time today after a plain effort first-up in tougher company. What the apprentice does from the draw will be interesting as he has led in the past. Needs some luck but he brings in some strong form lines from last campaign and there's improvement anticipated with the run under his belt. Ferrari Girl won in this grade two back when a hot tempo was set up front. She's likely to be prominent in the run again and getting back to this level is a key to her chances.

**Race Analysis:** The 2YO I Show Speed got the job done impressively on debut and turned in a good rating in the process. The extra journey doesn't seem like a problem with the time he ran last start stacking up against the older horses on the same day, track and distance. JVO needs to navigate the wide barrier, but if he can slot in or get across from the gate then he'll be hard to hold out. Under The Hood may be a little big in early markets as well with the added fitness of a trial under his belt. He was a solid winner first-up last campaign and the 1280m fresh looks a good move. Can lob just off the speed and if he can resume in similar form, he'll make his presence felt. It wouldn't surprise to see Missile Defence improve out in trip and back onto a firm deck. He felt the pinch in tough going at Wagga 18 days ago and he was very impressive when winning a trial on this surface last month. Expecting a better run from him. Son Of Zorro is putting up good ratings, though he hasn't been over 1200m since November 2024. He's been used sparingly over that distance and that leads me to think that the stable thinks he's a query at the distance. Happy to be against him in early betting.
